First and foremost, we would like to welcome three new <u>KIN chapters</u> at UC Berkeley, UC Davis, and UC Los Angeles!

With seven chapters operating across California, Massachusetts, and Indiana, they all provided nutrition education in their local communities. We also distributed recipe bags and curated location-specific <u>food access resources</u> for each region we serve, available in English and Spanish.

We have continued to collaborate with experts in the field, including pediatricians and RDNs, to further sharpen KIN's lesson relevance to underserved populations. IMPACT SNAPSHOT



PROJECTS	DETAILS	OUTCOMES
Education	Teams of 5 volunteers visit local elementary classrooms to teach <u>nutrition</u> topics once a week for seven weeks.	Our <u>annual research</u> continues to show greater nutrition comprehension and healthier food preferences compared to non-KIN students.
Food Access	KIN students receive f <u>ood</u> access resources and ingredients to prepare a healthy home-cooked meal with their families.	KIN distributed 221 recipe bags and food access resources to underserved youth and their families.
Family Engagement	The <u>KINcentive Program</u> seeks to engage families outside the KIN classroom through resources and activities.	942 families received challenges, worksheets, and newsletters for enhanced <u>parent engagement</u> . 25 participants were involved in lessons taught at a health care clinic for low-income families.
